Theopoetics Working Group Meeting

Until 11:59 PM Thursday, July 31st, 2014 there is an open call for proposals for a theopoetics working group meeting on during the November 22-25 meetings of the 2014 joint conferences for the American Academy of Religion and the Society for Biblical Literature in San Diego.

This meeting will continue to address the impact of employing embodied, non-propositional poetics in the exploration of theological practice and scholarship. Papers from the previous meetings can be referenced as examples of this trajectory. Additionally however, in our 2014 meeting there is a desire to focus particularly on theopoetics as it might be used in application or practice. Issues regarding trauma studies and the ways in which an explicit exploration of language and theology are particularly welcome. This gathering should provide an opportunity for mutual engagement for those whose studies and/or practices fall in the intersection of theological thought, poetics, faith, religion, and methodologies which emphasize embodiment.
